

Our guest speaker will be Joseph Ganem, Ph.D., Professor of Physics at Loyola University. Prof. Ganem will speak about pseudo-science in education, the subject of his thought-provoking 2018 book "The Robot Factory" which illuminates the unintended consequences of overly prescriptive and restrictive curricula at all levels of the education system.

Prof. Ganem is an author on numerous scientific papers on laser development and magnetic resonance. He has taught physics in the classroom for more than 20 years and has served on the Maryland State Advisory Council for Gifted and Talented Education.


STEM DAY APPROACHING




