#### "An Intro to Conditional Probability w/ Applications"

The next General Membership Meeting will be held <u>virtually</u> on Mon., January 18, 2021. The meeting opens at 6:45 PM for an informal "meet-n-greet", with the presentation on Conditional Probability beginning about 7:00 PM.

Our guest speakers are SSS members Dick Schwanke (Harford Community College instructor) and Dave Webb (Army Evaluation Center statistician, ret.). They will speak on the foundations of conditional probability, and how it is used to assess everyday problems ranging from quality control to medical testing. The presentation will run approximately 45 minutes, with time afterwards for questions, conversations, and breakout rooms..

If you wish to get a copy of the app, simply click to join the meeting at any time (preferably before the actual meeting). You will be given a selection to download the windows app, continue on the browser, or open the Teams app (if it is already downloaded).

However, other SSS activities are continuing, including the awarding of transfer scholarships to Harford Community College graduates continuing their science / engineering / mathematics studies at a four-year school. When dues are paid to the Harford Community College Foundation, all but the last \$25 goes into the SSS Transfer Scholarship fund. The HCC Foundation is a 501(c)(3) corporation, so your donation will qualify as a tax deduction, and you will receive a letter so stating. The mailing address is

## Showcasing Technology for People of All Ages

As Senior Science Society members know, Harford County has been home to science and technology innovation,. What has happened here has changed how people live, work, and play worldwide. Thus, it is fitting that Harford County will become home to a world-class Discovery Center.

The plan is for the APG Discovery Center (ADC) to be a place where students of all ages a place will explore, experience, invent, create, and play with technology, leading them to a greater understanding of the scientific principles at play, and the history of that technology's development. Potential exhibits featuring virtual reality will give visitors the opportunity to drive a tank or fly a plane. Other exhibits will explore the history and the future of highperformance computing. Senior Science Society members are assisting in planning and demonstrating these exhibits at the Center and will review them to ensure technical accuracy.

### **APG Discovery Center (cont.)**

ADC is now working to launch Phase 1 of the Discovery Center – the "Preview" Center at Water's Edge complex in Belcamp. The Center will provide interactive displays, maker space, and technical heritage exhibits; and will provide funders and visitors a small taste of what will be found at the permanent Discovery Center. On 13 October 2020, the ADC's Board of Directors signed a lease to locate the facility at the Water's Edge business complex. The Preview Center will occupy a one-story building that fronts Pulaski Highway and backs up to the Bush River. The facility will be undergoing renovations and the Discovery Center Board expects to occupy the space and open the Preview Center to the public in September 2021.

#### Mason Mullaney wins SSS Transfer Scholarship
