FY13 GOALS ESTABLISHED

Projects:

• Continue support of TNT day and similar events at the HCC and other venues.

• Double the number of elementary and secondary school teachers taught engineering, science and math by SSS members (in the equivalent of a one-week long short course) to 80.

• At least double SSS participation in special STEMrelated educational programs and clubs sponsored by elementary and secondary schools. Reach 2800 students.

• Participate in community events to elevate awareness and appreciation of STEM.

• Expand participation with Harford County PTAs. Membership:

• Increase general membership to 40 individuals.

• Involve at least one general SSS member on each standing committee.

• Develop approach to involve shut-in members. Fund Raising:

• Raise SSS member donations for scholarships to at least \$7,500.

 Award at least two SSS \$2,500 scholarships to graduating HCC students IAW established procedures and requirements.

Records and Documents:

• Continue Creating permanent hard-copy and electronic records of SSS transactions and meetings.
